# Pendeen

Pendeen Blog: What a brilliant first week the children in Pendeen class have had. They have all settled into school so well. They are confident, happy learners and I am sure that they will all have a fantastic year. This week we have been focusing on settling in and learning the school rules and routines. The children have been busy drawing self-portraits. In our topic 'Let's Explore' the children have been for a walk around the school to see all of the classes and adults. In RE this week we have been thinking about why God is so important to Christians. We have listened to the Creation story and thought about how God made living things, like jellyfish.

Well done Pendeen, I am very proud of how well you have all settled in.

This week in Trevose, we have been using The Three Little Pigs traditional tale to embed some literacy learning. Children have been investigating vocabulary, how to improve sentences and retell the story to engage the reader. The Year 2s have also focussed on who they would write a traditional tale for and why.

In their maths learning, the Year 1s have been learning to count on from single digits, identify one more than a given number and matching numerals with words. The Year 2s have been recapping their knowledge of tens and ones in numbers to fifty while learning to write these numbers as words.

In History the children have been introduced to the concept of significant historical figures and how they have influenced the world. They learnt all about Mary Anning, who was a fossil collector 200 years ago, and her contribution to science and for the role of women in this traditionally male-dominated field of study.

In PE, the children have enjoyed dance sessions focussing on animal movements - from slow, slinky cat moves to graceful sea creatures.

In Art, the children have used their fingers and mixed primary colours to explore how secondary colours are made.

The children have settled well into the new routines, and I know it is going to be a great

year ahead!









Tater Du have had a wonderful week and have worked hard in their lessons. It's a bit of a change for the Year 3s but they are trying their best and showing enthusiasm. The Year 4s are also working hard and helping the Year 3s, which is lovely to see.

In literacy, we are drafting our own 'age' poem, after reading three different Stone Age poems. Some children have chosen bubble age, animal age and even lorry age! In maths, Year 3 are exploring numbers up to 1,000 and Year 4 are exploring numbers to 10,000. In history, we have looked at the timeline of the Stone age, Bronze age and Iron age and also discussed how Stone age people survived by while considering assets and threats. In art, we looked at different ways we can paint with water colours and in Spanish, we learned how to say where do you live? (Dónde vives?) Vivo en Grampound Road! We're looking forward to PE today, where we will be working on our multi skills (the pictures show last Friday).

Wolf Rock have had a great start to the new academic year and have enjoyed settling in. In maths we have been focussing on place value of number to 1,000,000 and 10,000,000. We have been challenged to write numbers in numerals and words and have been finding powers of ten, comparing integers and finding 10/100/1,000/10,000/100,000 more or less than a number. In literacy, we have been reflecting on the meaning of the poem 'Caged bird' by Maya Angelou and what emotions it evokes. We have identified powerful vocabulary and applied this to planning our own poem about an animal of our choice. We enjoyed PE this week where we explored counter balance and embraced the challenge of working with a partner to create different counter balances.

- Speak to the class teachers on the gate every afternoon (dismissing children is a busy time, all we ask is that you wait until children are dismissed)

#### **Collection at home time**

Any children not collected on time will go to the school office after 5 minutes at pick up and wait to be collected. Parents/Carers will need to go to the office to collect them from there and sign the Late Pick Up Register.

Eg. Trevose pick up time is 3.15pm if not collected by then they will be in the office from 3.20pm.

If your child is not collected by 3.30pm they will then go to the wraparound club. A fee will be charged via ParentPay for late pick up to cover staffing costs. Thank you.
