Good afternoon,

She cooks delicious food, I would highly recommend parents to consider school lunches for their children, especially if you are in receipt of free school lunches. A hot meal can set a child up for the day,

but she can also provide sandwiches as an alternative.

Every day is a learning day for all of us at Grampound Road. On Tuesday I did a learning walk and visited all classes. I saw some excellent learning and was very impressed with the enthusiasm from teachers, teaching assistants and the children. Each class had an inspirational idea which highlighted some good practice. At the end of the day, I met the teachers and we walked around all of the classes to share the good practice. This included informative working walls for maths and literacy, detailed class termly overviews, beautiful handwriting and informative staff notice boards. We all agreed to share this good practice, so all the children will benefit. We also have some development points, which we will work on over this term. It is important that we can self-reflect so that we can grow and continue to improve out school. In that sense we model to the children that we are all learning and want to be the best that we can be.

After a conversation with a parent this morning, we have agreed to extend the buddy system to include preschool children who would benefit from having an older child to support them. Lunchtimes is an important social time and I would like all the children to have a positive experience. Our year 5 pupils were very keen to offer to help, I knew they would! I value your opinions and support; you can sometimes see things that we don't always pick up on. Working together and in partnership with each other is very important and it will enable us to go from strength to strength.

Thank you to all the parents that have joined in with the forums and SEN tea and talk session. I hope you found it useful and an improvement from the other forums that happened at the end of the school day. If you have any ideas for future forums or events, please let me know.

The school website has all the latest curriculum information for Spring, we have included the knowledge organisers, the curriculum drivers and the sequence of learning. We hope you find it useful and informative. I will also upload the power point from Mrs Westfield which she shared during the SEN tea and talk. This presentation explains the whole process from identifying a SEN need to the support which is available in school. We have had a lovely first week back in Trevose class! We have been getting settled into the new term and I have been so impressed with everyone's focus and resilience this week. We have been reading 'Katie in London' in literacy and have been thinking about who we would like to write a version of the story for. We enjoyed playing a game of I-spy to see what London landmarks we could identify in the story. We have also been thinking about the different seasons as part of our science learning. We went outside to observe the weather and plants and animals and discussed what season we thought it was and why. It was lovely to see parents on Tuesday afternoon for the writing forum, I hope you enjoyed seeing some of our learning before the forum.

Tater Du have settled in really well this week and have been working hard.

In Maths, we are working on a new unit of multiplication and division and in literacy we have been exploring a

senses poem based on a book called The Rhythm of the Rain by Grahame Baker-Smith. We will be writing our own senses poem soon.

In guided reading, we have begun a new book called Krindlekrax by Philip Ridley and in RE we explored the 5 pillars of Islam and their meaning for Muslims.

We had a great time in science yesterday too, classifying matter as either solid liquid or gas. We investigated some different products while we decided what they could be classified as. The children really enjoyed this, although their first thought was to eat the food stuff (honey and jelly)!













This week in guided reading, Wolf Rock have begun delving deeper into their class read, Listen to the Moon, by Michael Morpurgo. This books is set on the Scilly Isles during World War 1 and already the children are gripped. In literacy, the children have begun a poetry unit based on David Guetta's Titanium video, which again, they are all very enthusiastic about – we even managed to use this song in our warm-up in last week's dance lessons with Miss Katie!

In science, the children have begun learning about mammalian life cycles and comparing and contrasting them with other classifications of creatures. This links very nicely with our geography unit about farming, where children have learnt about the different land uses in the UK. They have recognised how important food chains are in the process of farming and how slight differences can have catastrophic impacts on creatures; their habitats; and the production of crops.

As mentioned, Miss Katie is leading the PE this half-term, and the children are working hard on an interpretation of 'When I grow up' from Roald Dahl's Matilda. The progress they made in 45 minutes during the first lesson is staggering!


ATTENDANCE

Expected average attendance for a child is 96.1%. Our attendance figures for last week were as follows:

In accordance with our attendance policy we will be sending some children home with attendance letters during the term to help keep you informed of your child's attendance in line with the new RAG (red, amber, green system). Collection at home time
