By focusing on impact above all else, SIAMS explores ways in which each school's theologically rooted Christian vision drives the work, and enables the school to live up to its foundation as a Church school.'

The visit was very useful and we have clear actions that we will be working on during this academic year. I will keep you informed of our progress throughout the year.


ATTENDANCE

In accordance with our attendance policy we will be sending some children home with attendance letters during the term to help keep you informed of your child's attendance in line with the new RAG (red, amber, green system). Below are the band widths, as a reminder, if your child falls into one of these coloured bands a letter will be sent home.
