It has been another very busy week in Pendeen. We have had some wonderful new equipment delivered to Pendeen class and the children are really enjoying playing with lots of lovely new toys. The children are all working hard to look after everything and are remembering to 'Choose it, use it, put it away'. This week we have been being scientists in our topic work. We have been looking at the features of different dinosaurs to sort them into two groups: carnivores and herbivores. We have been listening to information about the

palaeontologist Mary Anning. Have a lovely weekend.













We had a fantastic day on World book day and thoroughly enjoyed sharing our favourite characters and reading together. We drew and described our characters in literacy. We have also been learning about non-fiction texts and have been looking at how we can organise information in our own writing to share with different audiences.



In our PSHE learning this week we have been learning about how to keep safe; this has included learning about what we do when we are unwell, who can help us and how they can help us. We have also been learning about road safety and have been creating posters to encourage others to cross roads safely.

As part of Science week, we have been making our own butterflies fly using magnets! It has been great fun and we thoroughly enjoyed experimenting with different ways to make them fly along our skies.

Tater Du

Tater Du have had a great week and celebrated reading over 500,000 words as a whole class (on Accelerated Reader) with biscuits! They have been promised more if they reach 1 million by the end of the summer term!

In literacy, we have continued with our persuasive poster and will be displaying them around the school. We are telling everyone to use less plastic and SAVE OUR SEAS!

In Guided Reading we started to read Charlotte's Web and in Maths, both year groups have been working with fractions (ordering and equivalent for Year 3 and improper fractions for Year 4).

In RE were explored Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur and how Jewish people ask for forgiveness by God. We all thought of something we could say sorry for and made paper boats with our apologies on them.

Then we released our boats into the water!













This week in Wolf Rock, the children have begun their new whole-class book in guided reading: The Wizards of Once, by Cressida Cowell. Despite only being two chapters into it, the children are obviously enjoying this adventure story with its mythical, fantasy genre set in a land of wizards, sprites and witches.

In science, the children studied human growth charts about expected patterns of growth for humans between the ages of 2 and 18, noticing trends and differences between the genders.

In geography, the children were introduced to the term, 'food miles', and used internet research to investigate just how far some of our foods have travelled. They were clearly able to determine the negative effects to the environment, recognising that locally sourced products do the least amount of damage to the planet because they travel the least distance.

In maths, both year groups are developing their knowledge and understanding about decimals and the relationship with fractions and percentages.

In RE, the children have been learning about the Big Bang Theory, and how it helps explain the universe's existence – the HOW, while the Bible discusses God's creation – the WHY.

In Spanish, the children engaged so well with the lesson about ordering pizzas, with or without toppings, and I have to say, their pronunciation is superb – well done!












NURTURE


ATTENDANCE

Expected average attendance for a child is 96.1%. Our attendance figures for last week were as follows:

In accordance with our attendance policy we will be sending some children home with attendance letters during the term to help keep you informed of your child's attendance in line with the new RAG (red, amber, green system). Below are the band widths, as a reminder, if your child falls into one of these coloured bands a letter will be sent home.

Collection at home time
