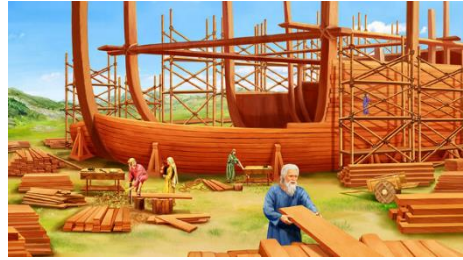


What is it like for someone to follow God? [People of God]?

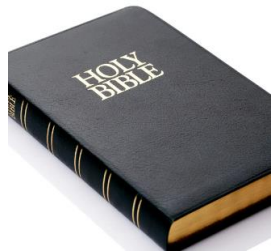
Noah

How would you feel if you saw Noah build a massive ark when he lived nowhere near water and it rarely rained? If you were Noah and people were mocking and laughing at you, would you have given up or would you have trusted God?



After the Flood

After the flood, God made the first covenant with man (Genesis 9). He promised Noah that He will never destroy the earth with a flood. Then God set the rainbow as the sign of His covenant between Him and earth. This covenant is called the universal covenant because it was made with all humanity through Noah.



The Bible

The Bible is made up of books, chapters and verses. We will look at how we can find certain stories.



The Story of Noah

The story of Noah (Genesis 6:5-9:17) tells Christians that God wanted to get rid of all the evil in the world to make it a better place.



Covenant

God made a covenant with Noah. These were rules that God wanted people to keep.



Forgiveness

After the flood, he promised to stick with people – even though people often make mistakes; God keeps on forgiving



Wedding

A Christian Wedding is a Christian sacrament where a man and woman make a promise to be with one another for the rest of their lives.



Rainbow

A rainbow is a sign of hope for the future within Christianity.

Vocabulary

Ark	Ark The ship built by Noah to save his family and two of every kind of animal from the Flood
Bible	The Christian holy book, which is made up of two main parts: the Old Testament and the New Testament.
Forgive	Stop feeling angry or resentful towards (someone) for an offence, flaw, or mistake
Old Testament	The first part of the Bible. Stories in the Bible which happened before Jesus was born. They often focus on the friendship between the main characters and God
New testament	The second part of the Bible. Stories about Jesus and his followers.
People of God	People of God is a description in the Old Testament that applies to the Israelites and that in the New Testament applies to Christians
